
OSHC

Academic Requirements:

- Successful completion of Year 12 or equivalent; or other relevant school qualification/s and
- Successful completion of a VET qualification in Australia at Advanced Diploma level or Successful completion of an Australian or overseas Tertiary level course such as a Bachelors level degree

Students who do not hold VET qualification in Australia at Advanced Diploma level or an Australian or overseas Tertiary level course will require to package with BSB80515 Graduate Certificate in Management (Learning) at SIC.

A student interview may be conducted prior to enrolment to verify suitability in BSB80615 Graduate Diploma of Management (Learning).

English Language Requirements: Academic IELTS 5.5 overall, no less than 5.0 in each band, or upper intermediate, or EAP from approved ELICOS/ESL centre

Pathway



All our VET courses are government approved, so they are recognised by Australian Universities and Higher Education Providers. You may be eligible to receive credit towards a Bachelor's degree program if you have studied Diploma or Advanced Diploma qualification with SIC. These credits (or exemptions) are normally granted on a case by case basis, so we suggest that when you finish your course here at SIC, you approach the university or Higher Education provider of your choice and find out what credits they will grant you.

The savings brought by transfer credits can be substantial. SIC has articulation arrangement with Australian Institute of Higher Education (CRICOS Provider Code 03147A), King's Own Institute (CRICOS Provider Code 03171A, Macleay College (CRICOS Provider Code 00899G) and Southern Cross University (CRICOS Provider Code 01241G).

Student Visa Information

All international students intending to enter Australia to study must apply for a student visa (an exception may be for students offered a program, such as an english language course, of less than three months). Details of the Australian Diplomatic Offices around the world where applications for a student visa can be lodged are available at the Department of Home Affairs (www.homeaffairs.gov.au) website.

International students normally must obtain a student visa before they travel to Australia. However, students from selected countries may apply for a student visa after arrival in Australia on a temporary entry visa. Again, details may be obtained from the nearest Australian Diplomatic Office. Student visas are issued for full-time study. International students cannot study part-time.

Students must provide evidence that they have sufficient funds to cover their tuition fees and living expenses whilst in Australia. Once enrolled, students must complete 6 calendar months of their principal course of study of their program before they can change to another education institution in Australia unless special permission is obtained.
